World History to the 15th Century (CHW 3M1):

- Learn about Egyptian, Mesopotamian, African, Greek and Roman civilizations, lifestyles and cultures.
- This course is valuable to students interested in studying anthropology, archaeology and ancient cultures.





- Learn about major world developments from the 16th century to the present. From Africa to South America to Turtle Island, a global perspective will be discovered, giving voice to those who have been historically oppressed.
- Topics include Medieval Mali, the Incas, the Transatlantic Slave Trade, colonialism, the French and Russian Revolutions, WWI ...
- Students will develop necessary essay-writing and critical thinking skills for future learning.

World History since the 15th Century (CHY 4U1):



Law

Highlights: debates, current legal case analysis, mock trials and a trip to the courts.



UNDERSTANDING CANADIAN LAW (CLU3M1/3E1):

- Learn about the history of the Canadian legal system, how to navigate civil lawsuits, how to fight for your rights and freedoms, and how the criminal law system works in Canada.

CANADIAN & INTERNATIONAL LAW (CLN 4U1)

- Learn about Canadian civil, criminal and human rights law, while comparing our system to the international legal system. This course aims to teach critically thinking & writing skills that will be invaluable to students who plan to pursue post-secondary options.



INTRO TO ANTHROPOLOGY, PSYCHOLOGY & SOCIOLOGY (HSP 3U/C1):

- Introductory course to help students understand the three Social Science disciplines of Anthropology, Sociology and Psychology
- Excellent opportunity to prepare students for Grade 12 courses also dealing with these disciplines.



Social Justice

Equity, Diversity, & Social Justice (HSE 3E1):

- Learn about historical and contemporary issues relating to equity, diversity, and social justice in a variety of contexts
- Students will design and implement a social action initiative relating to an equity, diversity, or social justice issue. Your chance to make a difference!
- This course prepares you for social justice studies in Grade 12.

Equity and Social Justice:

From Theory to Practice (HSE4M1):

- Students will develop an understanding of the theoretical, social, and historical underpinnings of various equity and social justice issues and to analyze strategies for bringing about positive social change, as well as learning about historical and contemporary equity and social justice issues in Canada and globally
- Students will use this information to design and implement a social action initiative relating to an equity or social justice issue.

- Excellent opportunity to prepare students for Grade 12 courses in the humanities.

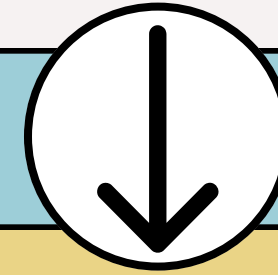


What are you and your baby doing?

- Your family also gives you a cultural identity. The "group" you identify your language, religion, dress, food, and celebrations with is often your family.

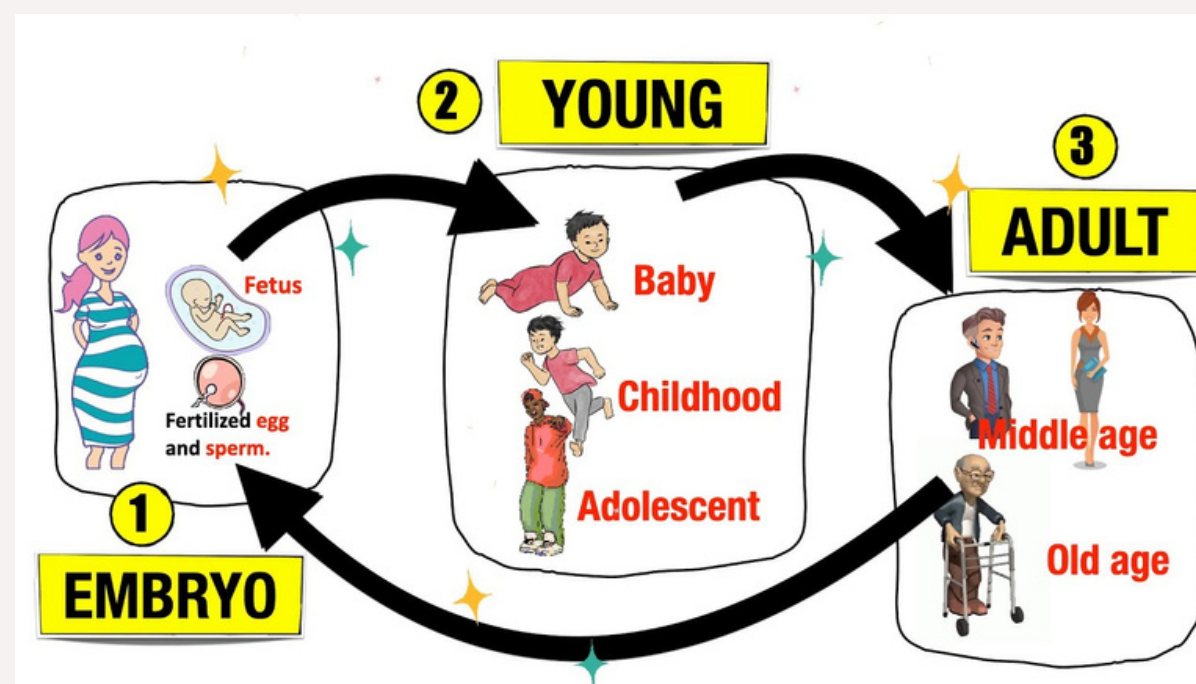

Nutrition and Health (HFA 4U/C1):

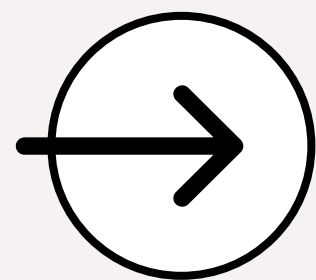
- Students will learn about current Canadian and world issues related to food, dietary choices and food preparation techniques
- A valuable course for students interested in pursuing food-related careers, or related fields



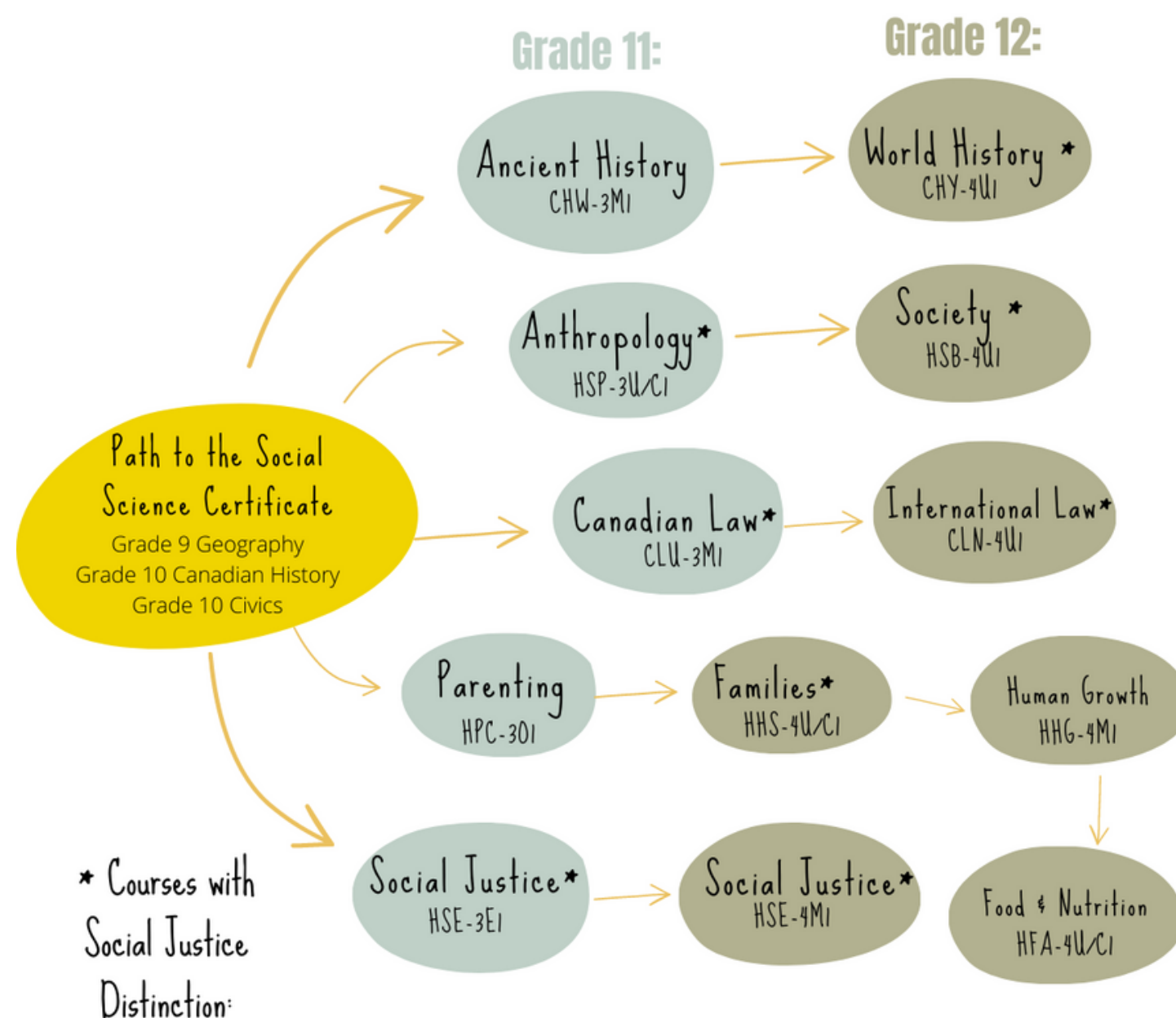
Human Development Throughout the Lifespan (HHG 4M1):
